DAAS Families,

We are excited to announce a few improvements to the district coming in the 23/24 School Year. We've heard feedback from staff, scholars and families and want to be responsive to the needs of more **consistency**, **collaboration** across all grades, and better **communication**.

Next year, we will move to a **K-8 model across the district**. Instead of being siloed by grade bands with separate principals, we will have a unique K-8 structure.

Ms. Manthiram will lead our school teams as the Executive Principal, supported by Ms. Chulevski as the Principal of ELA and Science and point-person for grades K-3 and Mr. English as Principal of Math and Social Studies and point-person for grades 4-8.

We have also decided to change the configuration of our buildings. We will move grades **2-4 into the EAST Building**. We are in the process of repainting, purchasing new furniture, and revitalizing the building in preparation for this move. **PreK-K will remain in the South building**. **1st grade** will move to the 2nd grade wing in the **West building**. **Grades 5-8 will occupy floors 2-4 in the West building**. This will provide for adequate space for all of our scholars to flourish and to provide better spacing for collaboration amongst peers.

We are excited about how this re-organization will allow us to maximize our district capacity and build upon our strengths in the 23/24 school year! We will keep you informed as we further develop these plans. If you have questions or additional feedback, please reach out to your principal!
